2. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS AND WARNINGS

- 1. Keep your work area clean
- 2. Observe work conditions: Do not expose welding equipment to rain of moisture. Keep the work area well lit.
- 3. Keep children away. Do not allow the children to ply or ride on with the cart.
- 4. Store way when not in use
- 5. Do not attempt to force the small cart to do the work of a larger industrial trolley. This cart is designed to carry small welders of approximately 25 kg and maximum cylinder size of diameter 20 cm and maximum height 120 cm and maximum weight 20 kg.
- 6. Do not modify this cart and do not use it for purposes for which it was not intended.
- 7. Use eye protection. Always wear approved impact safety glasses during assembly or whilst working.
- 8. Maintain your cart. Keep the cart clean for better performance.
- 9. Stay alert. Watch what you are doing, use common sense. Do not use the trolley or welding equipment when you are tired.
- 10. Check for damaged parts. Before using the cart, check the determine if any parts appear damaged and carefully check that the cart operates properly and perform s its intended functions. Check for alignment d any binding of moving part. Any part that is damaged should be replaced.
- 11. Maintenance. For your safety and safety of others working around you; regularly (monthly) check the tightness of nuts and other fasteners.
- 12. Weight on all the shelves must be evenly distributed and balanced for safety.
- 13. The warnings. Cautions and instruction discussed in this operation manual cannot cover all possible conditions and situations that may occur. It must be understood by the operator that common sense and caution are factors which cannot be built into this product must be supplied by the operator.

5. STATEMENT OF WARRANTY

- 1. Liability for defects that occur on the wheelchair after it has been sold within the warranty period rests on the obligation of the wheelchair manufacturer to remove the defect free of charge or by a service organization authorized by the manufacturer.
- 2. The warranty period is 24 months from the sale of the cart to the buyer. The warranty period begins on the day of delivery of the cart to the buyer or on the day of possible delivery. The warranty period does not include the time from claiming a legitimate claim until the truck is repaired.
- 3. The warranty is valid for the truck to be used in the manner and for the purpose for which it is intended. Defects and abnormal wear and tear resulting from insufficient care or neglect of seemingly insignificant defects, failure to comply with the owner's obligations, inexperience or reduced abilities, failure to comply with the instructions in the operating and maintenance instructions, use of the wheelchair for purposes not intended, are not recognized as defects; overloading the trolley, even transient.
- 4. In the warranty period are not allowed any modifications or changes on the truck.
- 5. Warranty claims must be made immediately after the manufacturing defect or material defect has been discovered, either by the manufacturer or the seller.
- 6. If the defective part is replaced during warranty repair, ownership of the defective part passes to the manufacturer.
- 7. As a warranty list serves proof of purchase (invoice) on which is the serial number of the machine, eventually a warranty list on the last page of this manual.

6. DISPOSAL
